With a federal election around the corner (October 21, 2019), this newsletter will suggest topics to bring up with candidates when they ask for your vote, or better yet, when you ask a question at an all candidates meeting!

## What's New

#### **Autism Diagnosis**

PONDA leadership met with Minister Todd Smith, MCCSS, to discuss diagnosis of Autism Spectrum Disorder following the <u>suggestion</u> by MPP Roman Baber that only developmental paediatricians and psychologists should be able to make such a diagnosis. Upon receipt of a letter written to the minister by PONDA, we were invited to meet and give our thoughts on who should be able to diagnose ASD, and how to balance accessibility to diagnostic services with quality and best practice. <u>Bottom line</u> – we feel a variety of physicians and nurse practitioners should be able to diagnose ASD, provided they have the training, demonstrate competency, and have access to subspecialty consultation if needed. Models of care exist around the province where general paediatricians make appropriate ASD diagnoses, often paired with assessments by allied health practitioners. Mentorship models for general paediatricians and family doctors also exist such as the Autism ECHO project from Holland Bloorview Kids Rehab that builds competency in ASD diagnosis and treatment in community settings.

#### **Mental Health**

Mental health care is stated as a priority for the Ford government, and PONDA is ensuring that individuals with neurodevelopmental disabilities are not forgotten as new policy is developed. Our leadership met with a senior policy advisor at the Ministry of Health to highlight the gaps in access to assessment and treatment for this group. Further meetings are to come, and further discussion on this complex topic will take place at our general membership meeting in November.

#### **Leadership changes at PONDA**

Dr. Alvin Loh, developmental paediatrician and medical director at Surrey Place, will be taking over as chair at the November 22 meeting. Dr. Nicky Jones-Stokreef will move in to the Past Chair position, and Dr. Mohammad Zubairi has agreed to become the new Vice Chair. These positions have 2-year terms.

## **Working Groups**

#### **Learning Disabilities**

There has been an increased interest by dyslexia advocacy groups to collaborate with PONDA in our promotion of evidence-based intervention for reading disabilities. In particular, ONBIDA has asked to partner with us to request that structured literacy be required by the Education Act of Ontario.

The Advocacy <u>Toolkit</u> on Literacy Based Learning Disabilities is in its 6<sup>th</sup> edition. A poster promoting the toolkit was shown at the American Academy of Cerebral Palsy in Anaheim, California earlier this month. Professionals need to keep advocating for evidence based instructional practices, particularly for the critical skill of reading. Only by convincing school board by school board of the need for best practices in reading instruction, will our youth at risk for LD have the optimal chance for reading success.

# Improving Health Care Capacity in Adults with Neurodevelopmental Disabilities (IHCCAN)

Dr Liz Grier, Family Physician, Dr Yona Lunsky, Psychologist and Dr Alvin Loh, have been meeting to discuss priorities for improving health care capacity. Family medicine residents in all training programs need to be given opportunities to care for adults with neurodevelopmental disabilities. Work has begun to create a funded PGY 3 Family Medicine Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities (IDD) Enhanced Skills program in Toronto, which will add to the only other PGY 3 IDD training program in Ontario, at Queen's University.

The Developmental Disabilities Primary Care Program at Surrey Place, has published <u>Guidelines</u> <u>for the care of adults with IDD</u>, and has updated many tools on their website, <u>ddprimarycare.surreyplace.ca</u>, which support the guidelines including some for <u>Transition Aged Youth with IDD</u>. These tools may be helpful for you to use and share with Primary Care Practitioners for patients transitioning to the adult system.

#### **New Media**

PONDA podcasts has been a hit ,with 2 podcasts currently available on the topic of Learning Disabilities and highlighting our Advocacy <u>Toolkit</u> for Literacy Based LD/Dyslexia. Stay tuned for our next podcast coming soon on the National Disability Insurance Scheme in Australia, and what this could look like in Canada.

#### **Parent Advisory**

We are pleased to share that we have two parents of children with complex neurodevelopmental disorders who are joining our regular steering committee meetings to help guide our work. We truly appreciate the time they give to PONDA to ensure our advocacy work makes sense to those who matter most, people with neurodevelopmental disorders and their families.

#### **Every Canadian Counts Coalition**

Bill Cowie and his team at ECCC is working to promote a National Disability Insurance program in Canada, similar to the NDIS in Australia. Here are some examples of questions you could ask your local federal candidates about this proposal:

- 1. As Canada is a signatory to the International Convention of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities, would the Government of Canada under your leadership consider implementing a national publicly funded disability insurance program given that it is the most cost-effective way of meeting its obligations under the Convention?
- 2. Under your leadership, would the Government of Canada consider appointing a Special Advisor to investigate and make recommendations regarding the operational and jurisdictional challenges associated with implementing a national disability insurance program?
